Studio City, California (Los Angeles)

Studio City is one of 24 named communities in the San Fernando Valley, which are part of the incorporated City of Los Angeles. Only 12 miles northwest of the Los Angeles Civic Center, Studio City is nestled in the foothills of the north slope of the Santa Monica mountains, a prime location for easy access to employment centers in Hollywood, Downtown, the Valley and Beverly Hills. The Ventura Freeway from Los Angeles and the San Diego Freeway from the coastal cities gives easy access to all of Southern California. It is easy to get around in Studio City and the surrounding areas by using the Metro Bus and Rail lines.

Jacksonville, Florida

Jacksonville, the largest city in the continental U.S., has beautiful beaches, a large music scene (including a summer beach jazz festival), theater, and so much more. Downtown Jacksonville offers many unique, affordable options to get from point A to point B and back again. Three historic trolleys provide free transportation around the Downtown area, including transportation to the Sports Complex. A 2.5-mile skyway is an automated transit system operating on an elevated track with 10 two-car trains. This convenient service provides transportation to the North- and Southbanks of Downtown throughout the week, and during special events.

New York, New York

New York City is a hotspot of art, music, theater and exciting free summer events. If you can't walk to your destination, mass transit (subway and bus system) is the next-best way to get around. The city's rail and bus system is run by the Metropolitan Transportation Authority (MTA) and known as MTA New York City Transit. It's inexpensive, environmentally friendly, and a great way to see sights throughout the five boroughs—and it operates 24 hours a day, seven days a week. Biking the city is good for the environment and your body and can often be faster and cheaper than fuel-powered transportation. Cycling hotspots like Central, Riverside and Prospect parks, and bike paths along the Hudson and East rivers and many bridges, are among the great options for hitting the City on two wheels—but all of NYC is bike-able and bike-worthy.

Washington, D.C.

Washington, D.C., is a vibrant city filled with historical monuments, arts, culture, and great food. The heart of Washington, D.C.'s public transportation is the MetroRail system. It provides service to the entire metro area and has numerous stations within walking distance of museums, monuments and other places of interest to tourists. It's generally safe, clean, and easy to use, and it has reasonable fares. Coupled with the MetroRail system is the MetroBus system. Capital Bikeshare is the D.C. area's newest form of public transportation. With over 100 stations and 1,100 bikes, this on-demand mode of transportation is a great, inexpensive way to travel around the city. It works much like the bus or the train in that you use the system to get from point A to point B. Pick up a bike at any station and drop it off at another station close to your destination.

San Francisco residents can take part in a wide assortment of community clubs, organizations, and activities, including interest groups, clubs, hobbies, community centers, and sporting events and activities. Established by voter proposition in 1999, the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) oversees both the Municipal Railway (Muni) and the Department of Parking and Traffic. With five modes of transit, Muni has about 700,000 passenger boarding each day.
